

## Prominent Livestock Dealer Passes Away

**Axel Oldenborg Died  
 At Bemidji Hospital  
 Last Friday Evening**

Axel Oldenborg, 52, prominent Blackduck livestock dealer and stock farmer, passed away early last Friday evening at the Bemidji Lutheran hospital following a stroke suffered at his home Wednesday evening. He had been suffering from a heart ailment for over a year and had been under the care of Dr. H. A. Palmer for some time. The stroke Wednesday left him paralyzed on his right side and completely unconscious, and he was removed to the hospital. He never fully regained consciousness.

Axel Manfred Oldenborg was born in Aashus, Denmark, on November 29, 1890, and came to this country in 1911 at the age of 21. Soon after coming to the United States he came to Blackduck, where he was employed as herdsman on the stockfarm of the Northern Cedar & Lumber Company, and made his home here until his death. He was united in marriage to his surviving wife, Agnes Sather Oldenborg, on December 28, 1913, at Moorhead.

Besides his wife he is survived by four daughters and three sons. They are Mrs. James Comings of Fort Sam Houston, Texas; Clifton, at home; John, of Waukesha, Wisconsin; Mrs. Roger Larson of Mizpah; and Gladys, Clara and Axel Allan at home. A sister and two brothers living in Denmark, and six grandchildren, also survive to mourn his departure.

Funeral services were held at the Lutheran church at two o'clock Tuesday afternoon with the pastor, Rev. Edmund Beaver, officiating. Because of the severe storm, it was impossible to get to Lake View cemetery where internment was to have taken place and the remains will rest at the Kolden mortuary until burial can be made. The pallbearers included H. O. Moen, A. T. Thompson, O. E. Jantaas, Tom Abrahamson, all of Blackduck, and Milton Bowman and R. Larson of Mizpah.

All of the children were here for the funeral with the exception of John Oldenborg of Waukesha, Wisconsin, who was delayed in Superior because of the storm and didn't reach Blackduck until late Tuesday.
