

Our reference: 13/10874

In the 1860s it was possible to travel in and out of Norway freely. Passport requirement had been lifted and it wasn't until 1901 that a new law concerning control of foreigners was introduced. That is why we do not have an archive of immigrants for that era. The only place where it is possible for someone to find information regarding immigrants is the churchbooks, which holds entries for people moving into the parish. Most commonly these are not complete (Henne: they were not always kept up-to-date).

We have looked in our register for citizenship in Trondheim 1835-1900, but we are unable to find records of Reese applying for citizenship.

We are able to provide other information. In the city bailiff/magistrate protocol (3L7 page 24) of deceased we find death number 9 in November 1908, deceased on 5th November: "Former pastrymaker Fredrik Wilhelm Reese, age 76, Strandveien No. 19. Widow Sofie is alive and there are the following children:

- 1) Dorthea, married to farmer Peder Sørensen, Jutland
- 2) Fredrikke, married to hatmaker C. Mortensen, Philadelphia
- 3) Max Reese, travelling salesman, at home (Henne: most likely this means he lives at Strandveien No. 19)
- 4) Johan Henrik, painter (Henne: the Danish and Norwegian word maler is ambiguous and could mean artist), America
- 5) Lovise, married to vognmand (coachman/trucker) August Dahl, Backly, Minnesota
- 6) Laurine, married to painter Hagen here (Henne: herstedes means something like this location/nearby)
- 7) Anna Schönemann, deceased, leaving behind the following children:
 - a. Rosalie, married to typographer Carl Svendsen, Kristiania
 - b. Rudolf, painter, New York
 - c. Fredrik, baker and pastry maker, New York
 - d. Arthur, barber, Chicago

The estate owns the farm No. 19 Strandveien including contents. The widow reports the death and informs that it is her wish to retain undivided possession and will, as soon as it is possible, receive declarations from the heirs regarding this matter. Deathcertificat was shown to doctor Arne Aas.

The heirs who are present (Henne: could be, the heirs who live nearby) have given their consent that the widow may reside in undivided possession. Declarations have also been received from Dorthea and Peder Sørensen, Fredrik and Arthur Schönemann, Johan Henrik Reese, Rudolf Schönemann, Lovise and August Dahl aswell as Carl Svendsen and also from Chiel Mortensen and wife"

1860-tallet var en tid hvor en kunne reise ganske fritt inn og ut av Norge. Passtvangen var opphevet, og det kom ikke noen ny lov om fremmedkontroll før i 1901. Vi har derfor ikke noe arkiv over innvandrere på den tiden. Det eneste stedet en kan finne noe om innflytting er i innflyttingslistene i kirkebøkene, og de er vanligvis ikke fullstendige.

Vi har sett i vårt register over borgerskap i Trondheim 1835-1900, men kan ikke se at Reese søkte borgerskap.

Vi kan ellers opplyse at ifølge Trondheim byfogds dødsfallsprotokoll 3L7 side 24 finner vi innført som dødsfall nr. 9 i november 1908, død den 05.11.: "Forhenv. Konditor Fredrik Wilhelm Reese, 76 år gl. Strandveien no. 19. Enken Sofie lever med følgende barn:

- 1) Dorthea, g.m. Jordbruker Peder Sørensen Jylland
- 2) Fredrikke g.m. hattemaker C. Mortensen Philadelphia
- 3) Max Reese, handelsreisende, hjemme
- 4) Johan Henrik, maler, Amerika
- 5) Lovise, g.m. Vognmand Aug. Dahl, Backly, Minnesota
- 6) Laurine, g.m. Maler Hagen hersteds
- 7) Anna Schönemann, død etterlader sig følgende barn:
 - 1) Rosalie, g.m. typograf Carl Svendsen, Kristiania
 - 2) Rudolf, maler, New York
 - 3) Fredrik, baker og konditor, New York'
 - 4) Arthur, barber, Chicago

Boet eier gaard no 19 Strandveien samt løsøre. enken anmelder dødsfaldet og opl. at hun ønsker at sitte med boet uskiftet og skal saasntart det lar sig gjøre erhverve erklæring fra arvingerne herom. Dødsattest forevistes fra dr. Arne Aas.

De herværende arvinger har git sit samtykke til at enken faar sitte i uskiftet bo. Erklæringer er likeledes indløpet fra Dorthea og Peder Sørensen, Fredrik og Arthur Schönemann, Johan Henrik Reese, Rudolf Schöpnemann, Lovise og August Dahl samt Carl Svendsen samt fra Chiel Mortensen og hustru".
